2.1 OA Games 2022

The Virtus Oceania Asia Games 2022 (OA Games 2022) is an international multi-sport competition in the Oceania Asia region for elite athletes with intellectual impairment. The event is delivered by Sport Inclusion Australia.

It is being held 5-11 November 2022 in Brisbane, Australia. It will feature the following sport disciplines:

- Athletics (Paralympic classification opportunity)
- Badminton (Demonstration Sport)
- Basketball
- Cycling
- Judo
- Rowing
- Sailing (Para Sailing International Championship)
- Swimming (Paralympic classification opportunity)
- Table Tennis (Paralympic classification opportunity)
- Taekwondo
- Tennis
- Triathlon (Demonstration Sport)

This is a milestone event, as the very first Virtus Regional Games for the Oceania Asia region.

The Virtus Australia member organisation, Sport Inclusion Australia (SIA), is managing the delivery of OA Games 2022 and is working closely with the Australian Federal Government, Queensland State Government and Brisbane City Council to host a world-class event

Our mission is to deliver a successful international major sporting event for elite athletes with intellectual impairment to compete in excellent competition in a welcoming and inclusive environment.

Our vision is everyone is included through sport.

2.2 Virtus

Virtus was founded in 1986 and is the global organisation that governs, advocates, organises and promotes elite sport for athletes with an intellectual impairment.

It works towards advocating for sport inclusion and the development of pathways for athletes with intellectual impairment to compete at the highest level of competition.

6. SPORT INFORMATION

6.1 Sanctioning

The OA Games 2022 has international sanctioning for the sports of Athletics, Swimming, Table Tennis and Sailing from the following organisations:

- [World Para Athletics](#)
- [World Para Swimming](#)
- [World Sailing](#)
- [International Table Tennis Federation](#)

All OA Games 2022 sport competitions will be run to the same standard of elite professionalism whether internationally sanctioned or not.

They are all governed by the rules of their relevant International Sport Federation (IF) and are not modified or adapted.

However the recognition by an IF acknowledges the importance and standard of the competitions.

6.2 Virtus Pathway

High-performance Athletes can represent their country at Virtus championships in 15 sports annually across summer and winter.

In addition, Virtus offers multi-sport Regional Games every four years, and multi-sport Global Games every four years.

All Athletes must meet the eligibility criteria and be on the Virtus master list to compete.

6.3 Virtus Eligibility

Eligibility is the criteria that defines the minimum impairment necessary to compete in a Virtus event.

All athletes competing in the Games must appear on the Virtus Master List prior to the competition commencing. We encourage all nations to have any new applications to Virtus by 15 September.

Virtus uses evidence-based classification and medical evidence to verify an athlete's eligibility into one of three Virtus eligibility groups known as II-1, II-2, and II-3.

II-1: Intellectual Disability

- IQ less than or equal to 75
- Deficits in adaptive behaviour
- Onset of disability prior to age of 22

II-2: Intellectual Disability with significant additional impairment:

- Athletes with intellectual disability and significant additional impairment.
- For example, this group includes Trisome 21 (Down syndrome) and Translocation (Down syndrome).

II-3: Autism

- IQ greater than 75
- Formal diagnosis of Autism

Virtus is developing the II-3 eligibility group for Athletes with Autism who do not have an intellectual disability.

This new eligibility group is being developed to provide opportunities to enable those Athletes to compete at the highest levels.

As with Demonstration Sports, II-3 events will receive a different medal and will not be included in the overall Medal Tally .

6.4 The Paralympic Pathway

For Athletes wishing to compete at the Paralympics, they must go through the Virtus eligibility and Paralympic classification.

Athlete classification is available at OA Games 2022 for the sports of Athletics, Swimming, and Table Tennis, which is the step towards pursuing a pathway to the Paralympic Games.

The relevant international sport federations (IFs) will appoint panels to undertake classification:

- **Athletics:** [World Para Athletics](#)
- **Swimming:** [World Para Swimming](#)
- **Table Tennis:** [International Table Tennis Federation](#)

Athletes wishing to undergo classification must:

- Meet the Virtus eligibility requirements and appear on the Virtus Master List

- Register with their sport-specific international sport federation as listed above
- Enter and compete in an event which is on the current Paralympic sport program

Classification is governed by the [IPC Athlete Classification Code and Standards](#). It determines which Athletes are eligible to compete in a Paralympic sport and how Athletes are grouped together, by the degree of activity limitation resulting from the impairment, for competition.

6.5 Youth Competition

In line with Virtus' aim to develop Youth competition, there will be Youth events held at the OA Games 2022 in the sports of Athletics and Swimming for Athletes in the II-1 eligibility group only.

The introduction of Youth events in Swimming and Athletics is to encourage participation of Youth competitors and introduce them to international competition, team dynamics and to inspire our champions of the future.

Details on Youth competition will be included in each of the sport fact sheets in [section 7](#) of this document.

6.6 Demonstration Sports

Demonstration sport events provide the platform to grow and develop a sport to include elite and international competitions for high performance Athletes with intellectual impairment, and for the purpose of becoming a medalled event on the official Virtus Sport Program in the future.

The OA Games 2022 offers two Demonstration Sports: Badminton & Triathlon.

Demonstration Sports will be conducted to the same level of professionalism, but as they are still developing Athletes will receive a different medal and they will not be included in the overall Medal Tally.

6.7 Anti-Doping

Virtus is a signatory to the World Anti-Doping Code and treats the issue of doping very seriously.

Competitors, Coaches, Member Organisations, Event Organisers and Sport Technical Officers should read and understand the [World Anti-Doping Agency \(WADA\)](#) procedures carefully and ensure they are upheld at every opportunity.

OA Games 2022 is subject to random doping tests in accordance with the Virtus Anti-Doping Policy, details of which can be found on the Virtus website by [clicking here](#).

Any Athlete taking medication that is on the banned substance list MUST submit a Virtus Therapeutic Usage Exemption (TUE) application and submit it to the Virtus Head of Anti-doping well in advance of their arrival in Brisbane for the OA Games 2022.

6.8 Medals & Ceremonies

Medal Ceremonies are formal and official occasions of the OA Games 2022 and over 300 medal ceremonies will take place.

Athletes will be recognised and celebrated for their achievements during the Games through the presentation of medals, the playing of the Gold medallist's national anthem and the raising of each medallist's national flags.

Athletes are expected to wear their full national tracksuit during medal ceremonies.

II-3 events, Youth events, and Demonstration Sports will have ceremonies as above and will be presented with different medals which will not be included in the overall Games Medal Tally.

7.1 ATHLETICS (PARALYMPIC CLASSIFICATION OPPORTUNITY)



The Athletics competition is sanctioned by [World Para Athletics](#) and will offer competition for II-1 (including Youth), II-2 and II-3 Athletes.

Youth competition is open to II-1 Athletes only. They must be between the ages of 12-17 years of age as at 31 December 2022.

The Athletics competition will be held from 8-10 November. It will take place in Brisbane at the State Athletics Facility, Queensland Sport & Athletics Centre (QSAC).

Athletes will have an opportunity to undertake IPC classification for T20 and F20 events – 400m, 1500m, Shot Put and Long Jump.

All Athletes competing in this sport are required to meet minimum qualifying standards (MQS) which can be viewed and downloaded by [clicking here](#).
